

LEGAL NOTICE

CITY OF LA HABRA HEIGHTS 2021 ANNUAL BRUSH CLEARANCE PROGRAM

Notice is hereby given that on Monday, February 8, 2021 the La Habra Heights City Council adopted Resolution No. 2021-03, which declared that weeds, rubbish, refuse, or other combustible materials growing upon or in front of properties constitute a public nuisance. In addition, dirt/debris runoff from private property upon public roadways are similarly deemed a public nuisance.

Such public nuisance must be abated by the removal of the weeds, rubbish, refuse, or other combustible materials. Moreover, dirt/debris upon roadways shall also be cleared. Failure of the property owner to abate any such nuisance on or in front of his or her property will cause the City to perform the abatement. The cost will be assessed upon the land and will constitute a lien upon such land until paid. All property owners are required to abate any and all hazardous conditions by May 1, 2021. A copy of Resolution No. 2021-03 is on file in the Office of the City Clerk.

Simply stated, all La Habra Heights property owners must remove and/or eliminate all fire hazards upon all improved and unimproved property by May 1, 2021, and maintain the property free of fire hazards after this date. Requirements for clearing property are outlined in the City's Brush Clearance Guide.

All property owners having any objections to the proposed removal of road debris, weeds, rubbish, refuse, or other combustible materials are hereby notified to submit a public comment for a meeting of the City Council of La Habra Heights to be held Monday, April 12, 2021, at 6:30 p.m., where objections will be heard and given due consideration. As a result of the COVID-19 pandemic, the City will evaluate the current circumstances before each meeting to decide if it is safe to permit the public to physically attend City Council Meetings. 

WARNING: Determination of compliance with Resolution No. 2021-03 will be made by inspection after May 1, 2021. Failure to comply may result in the removal of those hazards by the City's contractor(s). The cost of this removal, including inspection and administrative costs, will constitute a special assessment against such lots or lands if it is not paid in a timely manner. Brush must remain cleared throughout the year. The City may conduct multiple inspections throughout the year to enforce the provisions of the Municipal Code. 2021 WILDFIRE SAFETY NOTICE

Please carefully review the enclosed legal notice regarding year-round brush clearance. La Habra Heights is within a Very High Fire Hazard Severity Zone and fire prevention through brush clearance is critical for the health and safety of the community.

All properties must be cleared of all weeds, rubbish, refuse, debris and other combustible materials by May 1, 2021, and remain clear at all times thereafter.

NO EXCEPTIONS

The La Habra Heights Fire Department will inspect each property, potentially multiple times throughout the year. If your property is found to be non-compliant, the City will assess inspection fees and/or abate the property. Should this occur, all costs, including inspection fees and administrative costs, will be property owner's responsibility. If you fail to pay, a lien may be placed on your property for the outstanding amount.

2021 NON-COMPLIANT Inspection and Abatement Fees

(Properties compliant with Brush Clearance Program will not incur fees)

Costs include, but are not limited to:

First Inspection Fee: \$225

Second Inspection Fee: \$175

Abatement Costs: Actual Abatement Cost

Administrative Fee: \$1,275

Lien Fee: \$1,695

Lien Release Fee: \$1,695
